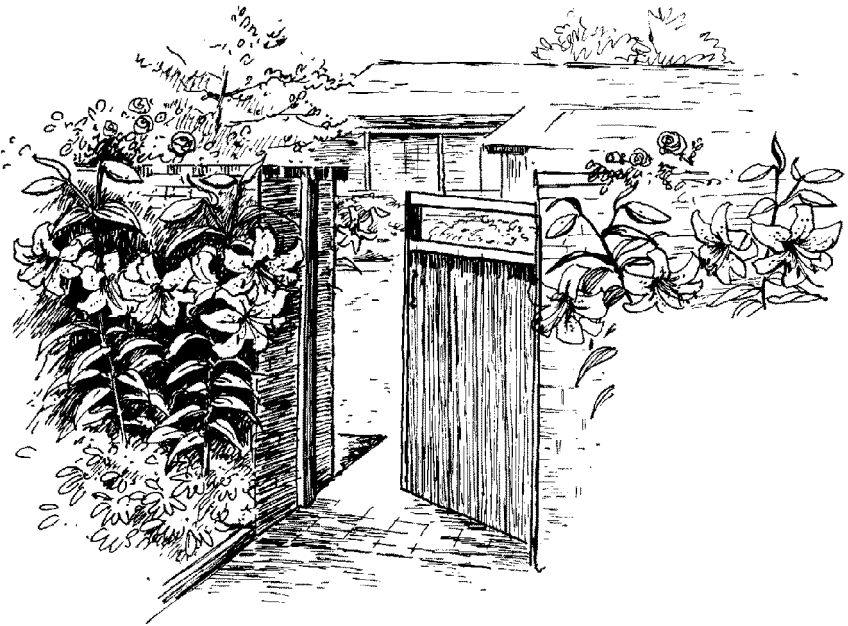

THE RULES

1. This is an **open show**; **all entries are welcome**.
2. All varieties in the exhibit should be named, if possible, however all roses **MUST** be named.
3. Entries should have been the property of the Exhibitor for at least 1 month prior to the show with the exception of potted plants, which must have been the property of the Exhibitor for at least 3 months prior to the show. Floral Design Exhibitors do not have to grow their own material.
4. Containers will be provided and must be used for all classes except where otherwise stated in the catalogue.
5. Containers used in the Decorative Section, all bowls, snifters and baskets will be supplied by the exhibitor, unless otherwise specified.
6. All photos in the Photo Section must be 8" x 10". No mounted or framed photos are permitted. Print on the back of each photo personal contact information and the class in which the photo is to be entered.
7. All exhibits in the Junior Section must be arranged by the Exhibitor alone. Juniors are children 15 years or younger.
8. A Novice is an Exhibitor who has never won more than three (3) first place ribbons in the Section or Division entered.
9. Open class is for anyone, whatever experience or expertise.

10. Provided entries are different cultivars, Exhibitors may make more than one entry per class, save in the Decorative or Junior Sections.
11. Any exhibit may be removed at the discretion of the Show Officials.
12. Exhibitors must not remove exhibits before 3:30 p.m. Saturday, July 4th.
13. All exhibits are shown at the Exhibitor's risk. The Show Organizers are not responsible for loss or damage.
14. Any decision of the Judges is final.

HOW TO ENTER

Entries are submitted to the Show Secretary by telephone or email, before Thursday, July 2nd, no later than noon. No late entries will be permitted. Please no calls after 9:00 p.m.

When submitting entries provide Section and Division name and Class number for each entry, as well as the Exhibitor's name and telephone number.

STAGING YOUR EXHIBITS

Exhibits may be staged Friday July 3rd between 2:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m., and Saturday July 4th from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m.

Entry cards will be available from the Show Secretary on Friday July 3rd from 2:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. and Saturday July 4th between 7:00 a.m. and 7:30 a.m.

When the type of container is not specified, the Exhibitor must use the container supplied by the Society. This includes collections.

All entries must be in one container unless otherwise stated.

Containers used in the Decorative section, all bowls, sniffers, and baskets will be supplied by the Exhibitor, unless specified otherwise.

Please name your exhibits wherever possible, however ALL ROSES MUST be named.

DEFINITIONS

Cultivar: Term for what is commonly known by horticulturists as a 'cultivated variety', or simply a 'variety', e.g. rose 'Peace'.

Design: A planned expression created with plant materials and space, including containers, bases, accessories or other components.

***ALL ENTRIES IN THE DECORATIVE SECTION
ARE CLASSIFIED AS EXHIBITS***

Exhibit: Plant material with or without accessories contained within a space as specified in a show schedule.

- Plant material must predominate over all other components of the exhibit.
- Fresh plant material must be in water or water retaining material unless such material remains turgid throughout the event.
- Painted and/or artificially coloured plant material **MAY BE USED** unless otherwise stated in the regulations.
- The use of artificial plant material is forbidden unless stated in the regulations.

JUDGING

Judging is done by experienced horticultural and floral art judges.

Judging will begin at 8:00 a.m. Saturday, July 4th, 2009.

Judges are to withhold any or all prizes where the quality of the exhibits is not considered worthy of an award. Judges are to award only one 1st, 2nd, 3rd prize, and any number of honourable mention prizes per class, if the quality of the exhibits is worthy, regardless of the number of entries.

All prize-winning exhibits will be acknowledged. Rosettes will be awarded to the best exhibit in each Division.

Any decision of the Judges is final.

ALL roses must be named.*

Division A - Specimen Bloom (disbudded)

Rosette awarded for Best Entry

1. One Hybrid Tea, Red
2. One Hybrid Tea, White, or Near White
3. One Hybrid Tea, Yellow or Yellow Blend (Peace should be exhibited in this class)
4. One Hybrid Tea, Pink or Pink Blend or Blends of these colours
5. One Hybrid Tea, Orange or Apricot, or blends of these colours
6. One Hybrid Tea, Any other colour (i.e. Mauve, Russet or Red Blend)
7. One Floribunda, Any colour (one stem, one bloom)
8. One Grandiflora, Any colour (one stem, one bloom)

Division B - Sprays, at least two blooms open, any colour

Rosette awarded for Best Entry

9. One spray, Hybrid Tea
10. One spray, Floribunda or Polyantha
11. One spray, Grandiflora
12. One spray, Miniature

13. One spray, David Austen English Rose
14. One spray, Shrub (other than David Austen)
15. One spray, Climber or rambler, or climbing versions of Hybrid Tea or Floribunda
16. One spray, Old Garden Rose (permissible to show O.G.R. sprays with just one bloom open and buds)
17. One spray, any other modern shrub rose (after 1867) except David Austen

18. Cycle of Bloom, 3 stems of one cultivar, one bud showing colour, one bloom at exhibition state, one full bloom (stamens may show), in one container

21. Bowl of Miniatures or minifloral (use your own container)

Exception: Class 110 will be staged on 48" wide x 48" deep black floor bases with height not to exceed 6'.
